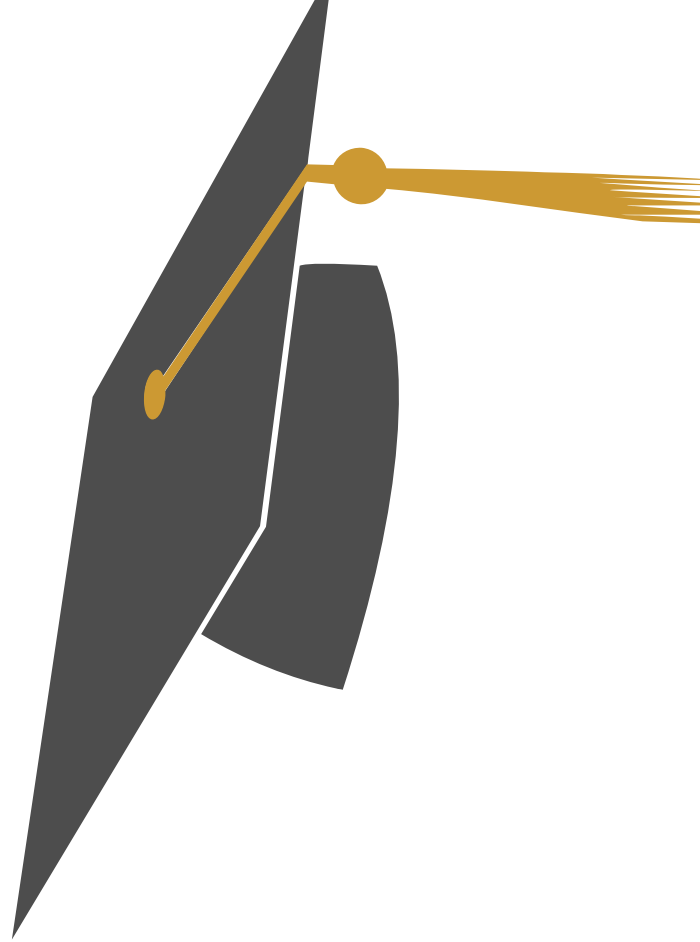
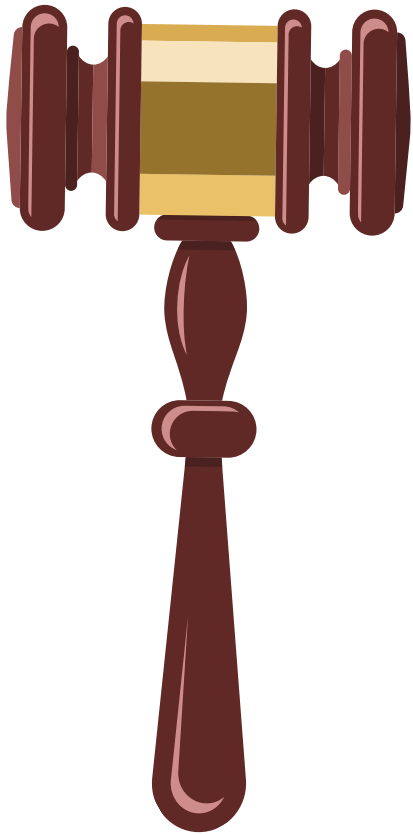

STORY TIME

1. President Oaks served as a lawyer and later as a justice on the Utah Supreme Court. He learned to be fair and follow laws—just like we can follow God’s laws.
2. His father passed away young. For a time, he lived with his grandparents. His mother taught him to pray and trust Heavenly Father and to believe in eternal families. That faith guided his whole life.
3. Before becoming an apostle, he led BYU and encouraged students to learn and live the gospel.
4. President Oaks married June Dixon, and they had six children. He teaches that families are central to God’s plan.
5. He has served faithfully for many years, teaching about Jesus Christ and the importance of following the prophet. He was called by President Spencer W. Kimball at the same time as Russell M. Nelson, and he said, “Nelson, then Oaks - in that order.”

6. After June passed away, he married Kristen McMain. Together they serve with love and devotion, showing that love continues through service

7. President Oaks encourages us to stand up for what's right, even when it's hard. He often speaks about the importance of Religious Freedom and what that means.

8. President Oaks was sustained as Prophet and President of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 2025. We can listen to him and follow Jesus through his words.
